◆ WASHINGTON INSURANCE LAW LETTER ◆

## “CLOSE ENOUGH FOR MEDICAL WORK”

For many, many years, medical malpractice was a very protected tort. Unlike most run-of-the-mill torts, a bad result was not enough to get you to the jury. You have to have expert medical evidence as to the standard of care and the breach of that standard.

Here, an injured patient sued her doctor as a “general surgeon.” But her medical experts were otolaryngologists. Not only were they not “general surgeons”, each refused to comment on the “standard of care” for a general surgeon.

That was enough (or rather, not enough) for the trial court judge. He dismissed the case, concluding that the total lack of expert testimony as to the standard of care was fatal to the suit.

The Court of Appeals reversed. It pointed out that while the doctors did not know the standard of care, and had in fact never performed the procedure in question, they had been to medical school.

## “SLIP & FALL”

### FACTS:

Smith worked on the second floor of an office building. The

only access was an exterior concrete staircase. One day Smith was leaving. As she descended to the third step from the top, she felt the step move under her foot. She slipped. She fell. She was hurt. She sued.

### PROCEDURE:

The landlord moved for summary judgment arguing that Smith had failed to produce evidence that the landlord had actual or constructive notice of a defect. He pointed out that he used the stairs almost daily, had not noticed any problems, had received no complaints, and the city had inspected. (He replaced the staircase a few days later.) The trial judge dismissed the case.

The Court of Appeals reversed saying there were issues of material fact as to whether the landlord breached his duty of care. The court appeared to be primarily moved by the fact Smith said that before her fall, she had noticed some lower steps were loose.

### HOLDINGS:

1. To establish the elements of her negligence claim, Smith had to show: “(1) duty ..., (2) breach of that duty, (3) a resulting injury, and (4) a proximate cause between the breach and the injury.”
2. A property owner’s legal

uty to a person entering his property depends on whether the person is a trespasser, licensee, or invitee.

3. Smith was an invitee. A property owner is liable to an invitee for an unsafe condition of the land if the owner has actual or constructive notice of the unsafe condition.

4. The property owner must inspect for unsafe conditions and “ ‘repair, safeguard[ ], or warn[ ] as may be reasonably necessary for [the invitee’s] protection under the circumstances.’ ”

5. The property owner has constructive notice where the condition “has existed for such time as would have afforded [the owner] sufficient opportunity, in the exercise of ordinary care, to have made a proper inspection of the premises and to have removed the danger.”

### COMMENT:

Yes, you read that right. Because the plaintiff said some other lower steps were loose, the landlord could be charged with constructive knowledge that an upper stair was loose.

# CLERK'S ALERT

## Changes to the Civil Case Schedule: Reducing from Filing to Trial Date

King County Superior Court is implementing a plan to reduce the time from filing to trial date on the case schedule issued in most civil cases.

The Court's current case schedule for the majority of the civil cases is 534 approximately 17.5 months from filing to trial date. The Court has determined that the current schedule is unnecessarily long for most civil cases. The current schedule prevents the Court from meeting state-imposed civil disposition standards. Consequently, the judges of King County Superior Court have voted to gradually shorten the civil case schedule from 17.5 months to 12 months. This change will be accomplished over a four-year period by shortening the civil case schedule by one week in the first year, 6 weeks in the second year, 8 weeks in the third year with carrying over into the fourth year. Beginning January 9, 2012, the Clerk will shorten the case schedule by one week approximately every five weeks, reducing the case schedule from that point forward. This procedure will result in doubling the number of cases completed every five weeks. The Court expects that recent fall-off in the number of cases will enable the Court to maintain trial date certainty.

During the second year, the Court expects to suspend this process for several months in order to evaluate the impact of the case schedule changes on attorneys and the Court. If the evaluation is satisfactory, the process of shortening the case schedule will resume. The Court will begin implementation of this change January 9, 2012. Schedules issued the week of January 9, 2012 will have the same trial date as the previous week's schedule. ## Shortening the Civil Normal Schedule

At its November 2011 Judges Meeting, the Court adopted a plan to reduce the civil normal case schedule from 17.5 months to 12 months (from filing to trial) over the course of a three year period. The Clerk's Office will begin implementation of this plan in January 2012. Below is the implementation plan and the evaluation plan for the project.

### Implementation Plan

The first case schedule reduction will be effective the second week of January 2012, and subsequent reductions will occur until the performance standard of 12 months is achieved. The Court anticipates having the 12 month performance standard fully in place by January 2015. Each time a reduction occurs, the schedule will be reduced by one week.

DJA will update the E-filing and Case Schedule systems each week that the Case schedule is shortened. The E-filing system will be down at 4:30 for approximately 15 minutes on each of the Fridays listed below. The Clerk's Office will post a reminder alert on the E-filing system in advance of scheduled downtimes.

Below is the schedule of changes by year.

### Evaluation Plan

In order to assess the impact and effect of this project, we will compare a control group of cases with a normal schedule filed in 2011 to cases on the newly shortened schedule filed in 2012 on the following:

- 1) Total and average number of motions for continuing trial date;
- 2) Total and average number of orders granted for continuing trial date;
- 3) Total and average number of hearings and trials held;

- 4) Total and average number of summary judgment motions;
- 5) Percent of cases resolved within pre-defined time frames;
- 6) Time to resolution for cases that have been resolved.

It is also possible to compare the two groups by cause of actions to further assess the effect of the shortened schedule on different kind of cases.

Finally, the Court requested a three to four month evaluation period during the second year of the implementation. This plan proposes that period to be July to October 2013. During that time, no decreasing weeks will occur. The court will then survey judicial officers and attorneys to ascertain impacts of the changes to date. After this evaluation period, the Court will decide whether to continue with the decreasing and at what rate. The Clerk will continue with the implementation of this plan unless instructed otherwise by the Court after this review.

### Communication Plan

DJA will issue a Clerk's Alert in late December 2011 announcing this project and articles will be authored and submitted to the King County Bar Association. The Alert information and these articles will be posted on the Court's and Clerk's websites.
